QUESTION:

Can the Hon. Minister state what section of the Customs Law or Regulation or the Liquor Licensing Law and Regulations is used by Customs to confiscate a case of rum or other liquor from Caymanians for personal use unless the person has a liquor license?

ANSWER:

Section 10 (10) of the Liquor Licensing Law (2000 Revision) states that no person may import into the Islands intoxicating liquor in excess of one gallon unless he is the holder of a licence.
