**THE INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATIONS TECHNOLOGY
(AMENDMENT) BILL, 2018**

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill amends the Information and Communications Technology Law (2017 Revision) (“the ICT Law”) to ensure that the ICT Law is subject to the Public Authorities Law, 2017 (“the PA Law”).

Clause 1 of the Bill contains the short title of the legislation.

Clause 2 of the Bill makes provision for the repeal and substitution of section 100 of the ICT Law concerning conflict of laws thereby ensuring that the ICT Law is subject to the PA Law.

1. This Law may be cited as the Information and Communications Technology (Amendment) Law, 2018.

Short title

2. The Information and Communications Technology Law (2017 Revision) is amended by repealing section 100 and substituting the following section –

Repeal and substitution of section 100 of the Information and Communications Technology Law (2017 Revision) - conflict of laws

“Conflict with other laws 92. (1) Where there is any inconsistency between this Law and any other Law, this Law shall prevail to the extent of the inconsistency, subject to subsection (2).

(2) Where there is any inconsistency between this Law and the Public Authorities Law, 2017, the Public Authorities Law shall prevail to the extent of any inconsistency.”.
