**A BILL FOR A LAW TO AMEND THE NATIONAL DRUG COUNCIL
LAW (2003 REVISION) AS A CONSEQUENCE OF THE CREATION OF
THE CONSTITUTIONAL OFFICE OF MINISTER CHARGED WITH
RESPONSIBILITY FOR FINANCE; AND TO MAKE PROVISION FOR
INCIDENTAL AND CONNECTED MATTERS**

THE NATIONAL DRUG COUNCIL (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2010

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill seeks to amend the National Drug Council Law (2003 Revision). The amendments are consequential upon the creation of the constitutional office of Minister charged with responsibility for finance.

Clause 1 of the Bill provides the short title.

Clause 2 amends section 6 of the principal Law to enable the Minister of Finance, instead of the Financial Secretary, to be a member of the National Drug Council. The clause also amends section 26 to enable the Minister of Finance, instead of the Financial Secretary, to give directions relating to an inventory of certain property vested in the Council.

1. This Law may be cited as the National Drug Council (Amendment) Law, 2010. Short title

2. The National Drug Council Law (2003 Revision) is amended in sections 6 and 26 by deleting the words “Financial Secretary” wherever they appear and substituting the words “member of the Cabinet charged with responsibility for finance”.
